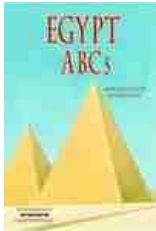

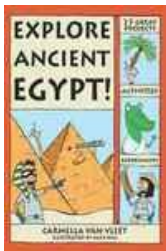

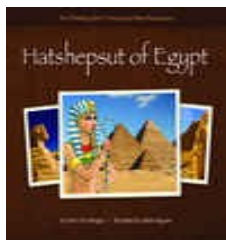

Hatshepsut of Egypt (The Thinking Girl's Treasury of Real Princesses)

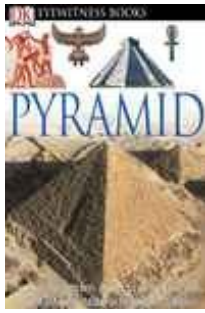
