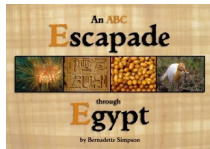

A Taste of Egyptian Cookery

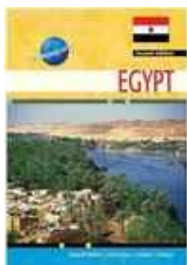

From the time Lower and Upper Egypt were unified, around 3000 B.C., the Nile River became the center of Egyptian life and culture. Along the banks of this river-the world's longest-Egyptians produced extraordinary feats of art, architecture, literature, and astronomy. Despite these accomplishments, Egypt's power began to wane by the Late Dynastic period (1090-332 B.C.), and the land's accessibility made it vulnerable to invaders. In the fourth century B.C.,

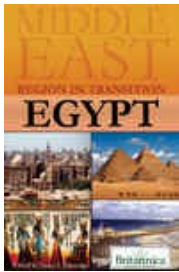
Persia became the first foreign power to conquer Egypt. During the next 2,200 years, Greece, Rome, the Byzantine Empire, the Umayyad Dynasty, the Ottoman Empire, France, and Great

Britain took turns ruling Egypt. In 1922, Egypt declared its independence from Great Britain and once again became a sovereign nation. Today, most of Egypt's approximately 80 million residents live near the Nile River, including more than 7 million in Cairo, Africa's largest city. **Young Adult (Ages 13+)**

Egypt (Middle East: Region in Transition)

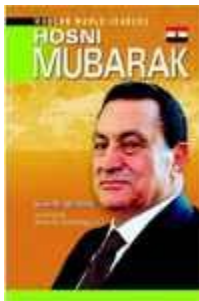

Hosni Mubarak (Modern World Leaders)

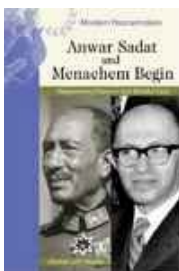

Anwar Sadat and Menachem Begin: Negotiating Peace in the Middle East

The 1978 Nobel Peace Prize was awarded to Anwar Sadat, president of Egypt, and Menachem Begin, prime minister of Israel, for their contributions to the Camp David Accords. These accords comprised two frame agreements on peace

in the Middle East, and on peace between Egypt and Israel. The choice of these laureates, according to the Nobel Committee, was notable because never before had they considered it fitting "to award the Peace Prize to statesmen from the troubled and sadly devastated Middle East." A hotbed of conflict throughout history, the Middle East saw a significant increase in strife after the establishment of Israel as an independent state in 1948. As leaders of their respective countries, Sadat and Begin were both hated and revered for their efforts to create a lasting peace in the region. Sadly, the consequence of such efforts led to Sadat's assassination by Muslim fundamentalists three years after becoming a Nobel laureate. "Anwar Sadat and Menachem Begin" describes each laureate's rise to power and the challenges they faced on the road to becoming modern peacemakers. **Young Adult**

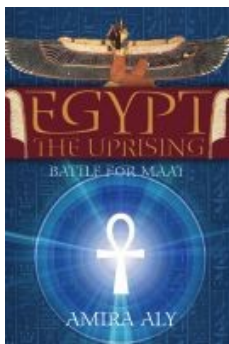

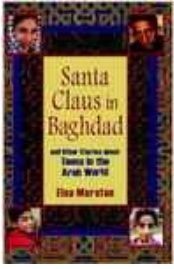

What is it like to be a young person in the Arab world today? This lively collection of eight short stories about Arab teenagers living in Iraq, Tunisia, Egypt, the West Bank, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, and a Palestinian refugee camp engagingly depicts young people's experiences growing up in the Middle East. The characters, drawn from urban and rural settings and from different classes as well as a mix of countries, confront situations involving friends, family, teachers, and society at large. Along with some specifically Middle Eastern issues, such as strife in Iraq, the hardships of life in a Palestinian refugee camp, and honor crimes, the young people deal with more familiar concerns such as loyalty to friends, overcoming personal insecurities, dreams of a future career, and coping with divorcing parents. Coming of age in a complicated world, they meet life with courage, determination, and, not least of all, humor. With accompanying notes that provide contextual information, *Santa Claus in Baghdad* brings a fresh perspective to youth literature about the Arab world. **Middle Grade/Young Adult**
